## **LUTHERAN DISASTER RESPONSE OF OHIO DISASTER PREPAREDNESS TRAINING**

Lutheran Disaster Response of Ohio is providing Level One Basic and Level Two Specialized disaster preparedness training. These educational workshops will provide training to volunteers in participating congregations, preparing each to form disaster volunteer teams. Each Synod Disaster Task Force assists in the formation of teams and the preparedness training. Recognized credentials will be provided.

Disaster volunteer training includes components on:

**Level One** - unskilled disaster response for debris removal and basic information on FEMA regulations

### **Level Two**

- **Case Management/ Coordinated Assistance Network** - how to identify and track client needs and the assistance they receive
- **Donations Management/ Aid Matrix** - how to coordinate and organize donated materials
- **Volunteer Management/ Disaster Response Database** - how to identify the skills of each volunteer and address risk management issues
- **Spiritual & Emotional Care** - how to identify and document qualified volunteers to provide spiritual care
- **Christian Care** - provide an appropriate level of emotional, spiritual and physical care to both those affected by disaster and team members
- **Lutheran Early Response Team (LERT)** - secure and maintain response-ready equipment and build the capacity to respond in a timely and organized manner
- **Construction Estimating** – complete rebuilding and repairing estimates for homes impacted by disaster
- **Congregational Facility Preparedness** – prepare congregations for a disaster to strike
- **Family Preparedness** - prepare families for a disaster by constructing preparedness kits
- **Pandemic Preparedness** – how to protect yourself from influenza viruses, especially H1N1, and how to respond when a pandemic is declared
